Eligibility for the Sequential Enrollment Pathway (SEP)

Please note: This program is only available to students enrolled in an ADN program at Modesto Junior College, Merced College, or San Joaquin Delta College.

- Must be in 1st, 2nd or 3rd semester of Associate Degree in Nursing Program at time of application
- Minimum overall GPA of 2.0 required
- FULL GE transfer certification including Chemistry and Statistics

How to Apply for the SEP

Summer Application: March 1- May 1

- Apply to Continuing and Professional Education (Link available on the website).
- Upload unofficial transcripts
- Upload ADN to BSN GE Certification (must be verified by community college counselor)

Eligibility for the Accelerated Online RN-BSN

Please note: This program is only available to students who successfully complete the Sequential Enrollment Program

- Completed 60 semester units of baccalaureate-level transferable college credit with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- · Earned an ADN degree from an instruction accredited by a regional accrediting association with a grade of C or better in each course.
- The following prerequisites must be completed by the start of the program with a grade of C or better (courses can be in-progress at the time of application).
- AP courses are accepted if the minimum score is met and accepted by the University.
- Current unencumbered California R.N. license

How to Apply for the Accelerated Online RN-BSN

Please note: Student is eligible to apply during the last term of their ADN program. Eligible students will receive a permission code to apply to the Accelerated Online RN-BSN track.

Fall Entry Application: November 1st – March 1st Spring Entry Application: August 1st – October 1st
