In order to be eligible for the ASBSN Program, all **eight pre-requisite courses** must be completed by the application deadline. Students must successfully complete all pre-requisites with a minimum grade of C. All pre-requisite courses must be taken for a letter grade (no pass/fail or credit/no credit grading option).

- REPEAT POLICY: Only the first science and first non-science prerequisite retake are allowed. Additional retakes will disqualify your application.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Advanced Placement (AP) courses are accepted as long as they have met the minimum required passing score (level/score 3 or above is passing).
- Have earned a BA or BS from an accredited institution in a discipline other than nursing.
- Bachelor's degree must be conferred prior to application
- Overall GPA of 3.000 (includes all of the student's entire higher education course record/history)
- Science Pre-requisite GPA of 3.000 (includes only the science pre-requisite courses)
- Non-science Pre-requisite GPA of 3.000 (includes only the non-science courses)
- No more than 1 science prerequisite can be repeated.
- No more than 1 non-science course can be repeated
- Minimum Test Score (Adjusted Individual Total Score) of 70% on the TEAS VII Exam
- In order to be evaluated for a potential seat in the program and admission to the ASBSN Program, all applicants must apply and submit an application to our program through CalStateApply
 - Apply to the ASBSN Program at www2.calstate.edu/apply
- All required materials must be submitted by the application deadline. Applicants are responsible for making sure the program has received all their materials by the application deadline. We do not contact applicants for missing materials or application. Incomplete applications will not be evaluated.
- Program admission is contingent upon meeting minimum requirements listed and passing a physical exam, drug screening and a background check.
